Part of why she loves what she does is the importance of passing the offering basket since donations keep the church going. She also likes the role of being in a position to greet newcomers with flowers. She appreciates that our church is welcoming without being overbearing.

Liz applies the strong organizational skills that she utilized during 25 years as a computer programmer (specifically as a mainframe COBOL user, which she says was fun!) in organizing the usher team.

When she was ready to transition from being a computer programmer to whatever the next phase of her life was going to be, a neighbor asked her if she could be a caregiver while she sorted things out. Many years later, she's still amazed at how 'in flow' the career change from computer programmer to caregiver was. She savors the people she has gotten to know during this 'selfless service' phase of her life, including the lady she helps who is 104 years old.

Liz also helps with the green bag donation collection, Sunday Suppers, and the silent prayer team. If giving and receiving smiles sounds like something you'd like to be part of, ask any of the ushers, and they'll smile and loop you in.

Labyrinth Ministry Celebrated June's Strawberry Moon – A Huge Success!

The Labyrinth Ministry celebrated June's Full Moon or "Strawberry Moon" by organizing a Full Moon Labyrinth Walk for the community on Friday, June 21st. This event was inspired by a full moon walk at the Sacred Garden of Maliko on Maui facilitated by Eve Hogan. Eve is a labyrinth facilitator and has been leading these walks on Maui for 28 years. Coincidentally, she is originally from Fullerton. Eve said she spoke at Unity of Tustin years ago and is familiar with our labyrinth, so we are hoping she may speak here again when she's in the area.



Our event was attended by 26 people, including five from the new Labyrinth Ministry Team. In addition to those from our community, we welcomed a number of people who had never been to Unity of Tustin. We even had a 10-year-old girl attend with her mother. Some participants had never walked a labyrinth before the event. A Sacred Acoustics Full Moon Meditation in the sanctuary set the tone and intention for the walk. Unity of Tustin Preschool - The Start of the Idea

In 2019, as our Board continued its focus on the challenges of financial constraints facing the church, it was noted again that revenues were almost entirely based on congregant giving, while the largest expenses were driven by the maintenance or improvement needs of our beautiful facilities and grounds. The task at hand was to find a way, or ways, the campus itself could generate additional income that would: a) not require a significant increase in giving from the congregation, and b) would be a



ligned with the spirit and purpose of the church. Complicating matters were tax-related laws and regulations that limit revenue use to religious and/or educational purposes since our church is a California religious non-profit that is exempt from paying state property taxes.

Ideas for a Unity of Tustin Preschool were conceived during deliberations on the subject. It seemed to fit all of the requirements: Educational in nature; Able to take advantage of the campus and facilities; No large up-front investment required if the right partner is selected; Perfectly aligned with the spirit and purpose of the church.

Improvements would likely need to be made to some classrooms, but would also benefit church programs already using those spaces. Initial exploration of the market indicated that there are preschool operators who would be interested in paying rent to use the facilities. The hours and boundaries of preschool operations would fit well with normal church use during evenings and on weekends.

In 2022, our Board took the leap of faith and initiated actions toward making the Unity of Tustin Preschool a reality. Evidence is seen in the fencing and gating of the youth gardens north of the Youth & Family Life building, and in the designation of the former book store space as the new center of operations for YFL.

More good news along this line will be forthcoming as the manifestation of preschool ideas evolve.

Deep Thinking at a MUTS Meeting By Kirk Reeves
